Experience Art, Culture, Live Music, Kids Programming and More at the June 28 Meet in the Street

WHAT: Meet in the Street, funded by the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District, connects

the 16th Street Mall as a shared public space activated through live music, kids' activities,

extended patios and arts and culture.

WHEN: Sunday, June 28; 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. (Additional Sundays: July 5, July 19, August 2, and August 9)

WHERE: On the 16th Street Mall between Tremont and Lawrence Streets. *Please note: The 16th Street*

Free MallRide service will be detoured onto 15th and 17th Streets via the Free MetroRide busses

all day to make room for the activities.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Programming for the June 28 Meet in the Street includes the following. Please note programming will change throughout the five Sundays of Meet in the Street, with new surprises each Sunday.

Live Music: Visit the area near the Clocktower for music by <u>Eef & The Blues Express</u> (from 11 a.m.-2 p.m.) and the <u>Anna Lisa Trio</u> (from 3 p.m.-6 p.m.). Between Champa and Curtis, listen to music by <u>Kaia Nutting</u> (11 a.m.-1 p.m.), <u>Chris Webb</u> (1:30 p.m.-3:30 p.m.) and <u>Rob Drakin</u> Acoustic (4 p.m.-6 p.m.).

Art & Culture:

- Gammaspace, a workspace and artist collective in Northwest Denver that builds large-scale art, will be featuring five sculptures, partially funded through art grants from Apogaea, Colorado's regional Burning Man event. The sculptures will be present all day on the block between Welton and California, but will be lit from dusk until 9 p.m.
- Artists from MADE will create and sell art on the block between Stout and Champa.

Kids Areas: The entire Mall will feature family-friendly activities, but visit the block between California and Stout for kids' music, face painting, a giant sandbox, picnic tables and special activities presented by History Colorado and the Denver Public Library.

Expanded Patio Seating: Visit the block between Glenarm and Welton for extended patio seating at Marlowe's, Appaloosa and Paramount Café, and live music at Appaloosa. Other participating restaurants include Rialto Café and Tilted Kilt.

Relax & Recharge: Meet in the Street provides programming to keep you busy all day and into the evening; it also gives you a chance to relax. Sit in rocking chairs between Champa and Curtis to enjoy live music and the Colorado outdoors.
